It encourages EV drivers to charge their vehicles when electricity costs less. This reduction in peak energy helps the overall cost of electricity down to the entire co-op.

ENERGY EFFICIENCY TIP OF THE MONTH

Is your home heating system ready for the winter chill? If your home is heated through warmair registers, baseboard heaters or radiators, remember to clean regularly to boost efficiency, and make sure all air vents are unobstructed from furniture, drapes, or other items to ensure sufficient circulation throughout your home.

Winter load control begins

December through February, REC's power supplier, Dairyland Power Cooperative, may call for full load control (reduced electricity consumption) on days when the demand for electricity is high, which equals more expensive electricity purchased at these times. If you participate in our controlled electric heat program, make certain your back-up heating system and fuel source are fully functional.

Winter full load control Peak Alerts are between 7:00 a.m. - 10:00 a.m.

You can check our website anytime for the status of load control. Peak Alert notices will also be broadcast by area radio stations and on our Facebook page.



Before hanging holiday lights outside, look for overhead power lines. Never throw light strands into trees near power lines.

- Inspect all the lights you plan on using. Make sure the wires are in good condition—not cracked, brittle, or frayed. The sockets should not be damaged, and no light bulbs should be missing.
- Check that all light strands are certified and rated for the conditions in which they'll be used.
- Never string more than three strands of lights together unless the packaging says it is safe to do so. Overloaded cords or outlets could start a fire.
- Never tack or nail through a strand of lights. Do not place cords under rugs or in high traffic areas.
- **Lighted and electrical outdoor decorations should be plugged** into ground fault circuit interrupter (GFCI) protected outlets.
- Turn holiday lights off before going to sleep or leaving the house. A timer can help you do this.



WINTER ENERGY SAVING TIPS

The following tips will save money and energy while staying comfortable during the cold winter months.

- Set the ceiling fan to run in reverse to create an updraft that helps move warm air trapped near the ceiling back out and around the room.
- Lower your thermostat a few degrees, ideally to 68 degrees or lower.
- Adjust your programmable thermostat to automatically lower the temperature while you are away or while you sleep.
- During daylight hours, open drapes, and blinds to maximize heat from direct sunlight. To retain heat, keep them closed when it is dark.
- Keep interior doors open to help circulate air more freely and maintain constant heating levels.
- Seal cracks and openings to prevent cold air from leaking into your
- Add caulk or weatherstripping to seal air leaks around doors and windows.

Stay in your vehicle if power lines are down

Following an accident or storm that drops power lines around your car:

- Stay inside your car until power is shut off; the ground outside may be energized.
- Do not drive over wires; they may be live with high-voltage electricity.
- Call 911 and keep others away until help arrives.
- If you must exit the vehicle, jump clear so no part of your body touches the car when you land.
- Keep both feet together and shuffle or hop at least 40 feet away. Keeping feet together and on the ground minimizes the chance for electrocution.
- Always assume the ground and power lines are energized and dangerous.
