DID YOU KNOW? Due to a decrease in natural gas consumption and an increase in production, the U.S. Energy Information Administration is forecasting the price will average 47% lower in 2023 than in 2022. (Natural gas prices have a strong correlation to Riverland's cost of power.)

Home Energy Audit Rebates Available

A home performance audit is the best way to identify problems and solutions to improve comfort and energy efficiency in your home. The test typically takes a couple of hours and costs about \$350-400. Have it arranged through Riverland Energy and we'll credit you \$150 of that cost.

In addition, Riverland Energy offers an incentive of up to \$500 for qualified improvements made after a home performance test.

Right-of -Way Maintenance Program

Our Right-of-Way maintenance program helps prevent power interruptions by trimming or removing trees and brush which could be potential fire hazards or cause power outages. Tree-toline contact can also cause momentary interruptions or blinks in power. Tree trimming helps prevent extended outages during storms or strong winds. Riverland rotates around the service area each year to keep up with tree growth.

In 2023, we are focusing on **Elk Creek, Hegg,** and **Brice Prairie** substations for a total of 290 miles of line.

You may see bucket trucks from Zielie's, our tree trimming contractor, in your neighborhood. Members in those areas will receive an automated phone call when they will be in your area.
